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Mid-week Pennant – into the Metropolitan 6 a Side Grand Final – but not quite good enough to win it

A very solid win in our Semi-final

Last Thursday we played our Metropolitan 6 a Side Semi-final at the very pleasant Hawthorn Bowls Club. In beautiful conditions, on an excellent Green, and where our Rinks had widely differing early performances, we took on Camberwell Central. After, a tussle before the Break, we progressively broke away to take a solid win (46-29) to advance to the Grand Final. Rink Results:

Manny Flores, with Lynne Grogan & Murray Whiteway – 23-15 after getting away to an 11 shot lead at eight ends, we fought off two opposition challenges in the second half of the game to hold on to an 8 shot win.

John Grogan, with Albert Considine & Sean Lee – 23-14 after trailing by 7 shots early, before gradually winding in the opposition to take the lead by winning eight successive ends – and finishing off just as strongly.

It was always going to be a big ask, but our team put in a fighting effort against Glenroy at Strathmore earlier today. The powerhouse, Glenroy team featured three Division 1 bowlers and, despite a gallant effort from our team, we could not hold them well enough for the whole game – suffering a 40-55 loss. Rink Results: **Manny Flores**, with Lynne Grogan & Murray Whiteway – 13-33 after keeping things tight for most of the game, before conceding 16 shots on a four-end losing sequence.

John Grogan, with Stuart O'Brien & Sean Lee – 27-22 after a slow start before we progressively pegged back the lead to tie things up after thirteen ends. A 6 shot loss on two ends was quickly retrieved, before we lost another 2, then won back 3 to go into the last end with scores tied. An excellent effort delivered 5 shots, and the Rink win.

Pick it up, or return the bowl?

A regular point of contention in our game relates to the action that should be taken when a bowl is encroaching your rink on the correct, or incorrect, bias. Do you stop the bowl, return it to the bowler, or do you lift any bowls in the way of the intruding bowl?

In summary, the Laws of the Sport allow a player to stop a bowl, <u>or</u> lift a bowl that is/might stop the bowl returning to its correct rink. Both are **correct; however**, the preferred process is to stop the bowl and return it to the bowler - but only if the bowl was on a path to bring it back into the rink. A bowl on the wrong bias would not be returned. If the bowl is not on a path to bring it back, it is a dead bowl and should not be returned. The rationale for this preferred approach is:

- 1. When you lift a bowl, it's most unlikely it will be returned to its exact position (and this could affect the result of the end).
- 2. The law only refers to lifting a bowl and not multiple bowls. The comedy routine of trying to lift two or three bowls, and even a jack, can see bowlers stumble, or worse, when trying to manoeuvre to lift multiple bowls.
- 3. Stopping a bowl is a clearer and cleaner process and it less likely to cause a head to be disturbed.
